Know ye, That at Mexico in the County of Oswego, on the 14 day of November A. D. 1864

before J. W. Shinn Surrogate of our said County, The last Will and Testament of George W. Palmer deceased, was proved, and is now approved and allowed by us:

And the said Testat^r at or immediately previous to his death, being an inhabitant of, or having left assets which then were, or have since come within the said County of Oswego, by reason whereof the proving and registering of the said Will, and granting administration of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Testat^r and also the auditing, allowing and final discharging the account thereof, do belong unto the Surrogate of said County: The administration of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased and in any way concerning his Will, is granted unto

the Execut^r in the said Will named, he having first taken and subscribed on oath or affirmation, faithfully and honestly to discharge the duties of such Execut^r: hereby requiring you to make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Testat^r within a reasonable time, and return a duplicate thereof to our Surrogate, of the County of Oswego, within three months from the date of these presents; and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any Inventory, that shall have been so made, shall come to your possession or knowledge, to make or cause to be made in like manner, a true and perfect Inventory thereof, and return the same within two months after discovery thereof; and also to render a just and true account of the administration when thereunto required.

LETTERS OF ADMINISTRATION

The People of the State of New York,

to Esther Mc Bride

Send Greeting:

Whereas John Mc Bride as is alleged, lately died intestate, being at or immediately previous to his death, an inhabitant of, or having left assets which then were or have since come within the County of Oswego, by means whereof the ordering and granting administration of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of which the said intestate died possessed, and also the auditing, allowing and final discharging the account thereof, do belong unto our Surrogate of the County of Oswego: And we, being desirous that the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said intestate shall be well and faithfully administered, applied and disposed of, do grant unto you the said Esther Mc Bride

full power, by these Presents, to administer and faithfully dispose of all and singular the said Goods, Chattels and Credits; to ask, demand, recover and receive the debts which unto the said intestate, whilst living, and at the time of his death, did belong; and to pay the debts which the said intestate did owe as far as such Goods, Chattels and Credits will thereto extend, and the law requires; hereby requiring you to make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said intestate, within a reasonable time, and return a duplicate thereof to our Surrogate of the County of Oswego, within three months from the date of these Presents; and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory, that shall have been so made, shall come to your possession or knowledge, to make or cause to be made, in like manner, a true and perfect inventory thereof, within two months after discovery thereof.

And we do by these Presents, depute, constitute and appoint you, the said Esther Mc Bride

Administrat^r of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits which were of the said John Mc Bride deceased.
