Know all men that whereas the said John Carwell deceased was seized in fee simple of certain lands situate in the County of Oswego, on the nineteenth day of May A.D. 1849 before Orla H. Whitney County Judge of our said County. The last will and testament of the said deceased was proved and is now approved and allowed by us. And the said testator at or immediately previous to his death being an inhabitant of or having left assets which then were or have since come within the County of Oswego, by reason whereof the proving and registering of the said will and granting Administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said testator and also the auditing, allowing and final discharging the account thereof do belong unto our County Judge of the said County. The Administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased but in any way concerning his will. So Grant unto Charles Utter the Executor in the said will named and having first taken and subscribed an oath or affirmation faithfully and honestly to discharge the duties of such Executor. And by requiring you to make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said testator within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the County of Oswego, within three months from the date of these presents. And if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been so made shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof, and return the same within two months after discovery thereof. And also to render a just and true account of the Administration when the same shall be required.

The people of the State of New York. To Alva Carwell send Greeting.

Whereas John Carwell was alleged lately died intestate, being at or immediately previous to his death an inhabitant of or having left assets which then were or have since come within the County of Oswego, by means whereof the ordering and granting Administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of which the said intestate died possessed, and also the auditing, allowing and final discharging the account thereof do belong unto our County Judge of the County of Oswego; And we being desirous that the goods, chattels and credits of the said intestate shall be well and faithfully administered applied and disposed of. So Grant unto you the said Alva Carwell full power by these presents to administer and faithfully dispose of all and singular the said goods, chattels and credits, to pay the debts and demands due and owing to the said intestate at the time of his death did belong; And to pay the debts which the said intestate did owe, as far as such goods, chattels and credits will thereto extend and the Law require; And by requiring you to make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said intestate, within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the County of Oswego within three months from the date of these presents. And if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been so made shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof within two months after discovery thereof.

And we do by these presents depute constitute and appoint you the said Alva Carwell Administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits which were of the said John Carwell deceased.
