And we do by these presents, create, constitute and appoint you the said Collins Boman administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits which were of the said Collins Boman deceased, in testimony whereof we have caused the seal of the surrogate's court of our said County of Oswego to be hereunto affixed.
