Know Ye That at Muesic in the county of Oswego in the tenth day of November A.D. 1849 before Orin H. Whitney County Judge of our said County the last will and Testament of Adolphus Green deceased was proved and is now approved and allowed by us: And the said Testator at or immediately previous to his death being an inhabitant of or having left assets which then were or have since come within the said County of Oswego, by reason whereof the proving and registering of said will and granting administration of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said Testator and also the auditing allowing and final discharging the account thereof do belong unto our County Judge of the said County. The administration of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased and in any way concerning the same will be granted unto Phineas Converse & Benjamin Green the Executors in the said will named, they having first taken and subscribed an oath or affirmation faithfully and honestly to discharge the duties of such Executors: hereby requiring you to make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said Testator within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the County of Oswego within three months from the date of these presents; and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been so made shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof. And return the same within two months after discovery thereof. And also to render a just and true account of the administration when demanded or required.

The people of the State of New York to Adelia Griswold send greeting.

Whereas George Griswold as is alleged lately died intestate being at or immediately previous to his death an inhabitant of or having left assets which then were or have since come within the county of Oswego, by means whereof the ordering & granting administration of all and singular the goods chattels & credits of which the said intestate died possessed, and also the auditing allowing and final discharging the account thereof do belong unto our County Judge of the County of Oswego: And we being desirous that the goods chattels & credits of the said intestate shall be well & faithfully administered & applied & disposed of. Do Grant unto you the said Adelia Griswold full power by these presents to administer & faithfully dispose of all & singular the said goods chattels & credits: to ask demand & receive & receive the debts which unto the said intestate, which living & at the time of his death did belong. And to pay the debts which the said intestate did owe, so far as such goods chattels & credits will thereto extend & the law require: hereby requiring you to make or cause to be made a true & perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said intestate, within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the County of Oswego within three months from the date of these presents: and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been so made, shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof, within two months after discovery thereof.

And we do by these presents, create, constitute & appoint you the said Adelia Griswold Administratrix of all and singular the goods, Chattels and Credits, which were of the said George Griswold deceased.
