

The people of the State of New York To Henry Williams
John Price & William Hale send greeting

Whereas Henry Williams, as is alleged, lately died intestate, being at or immediately previous to his death an inhabitant of, or having left assets which then were or have since come within the county of Oswego, by means whereby the ordering & granting administration of all and singular the goods, chattels & credits of which the said intestate died seised, and also the auditing, allowing & finally discharging the account thereof, do belong unto our County Judge of the County of Oswego: And we, being desirous that the goods, chattels & credits of the said intestate shall be well & faithfully administered, applied & disposed of, Do Grant unto you the said Henry Williams, John Price & William Hale full power by their presents, to administer faithfully dispose of all & singular the said goods, chattels & credits: to ask demand receive & receive the debt which into the said intestate, which living at the time of his death did belong: And to pay the debt which the said intestate did owe, as far as such goods, chattels, and credits will thereto extend: & the said receiver hereby requiring you to make or cause to be made a true & perfect inventory of all & singular the goods, chattels & credits of the said intestate within a reasonable time, and return a duplicate thereof, to our County Judge of the County of Oswego, within three months from the date of these presents: And if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been so made, shall come to your possession or knowledge, to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof, within two months after the discovery thereof.

And we do by these presents, dispute & constitute and appoint you the said Henry Williams, John Price and William Hale, administrators of all and singular the goods, chattels & credits which were of the said Henry Williams deceased.

Know ye that at New York in the County of Albany, on the 10th day of January A.D. 1850 before Orin H. Whitney County Judge of our said County the last will and testament of Cyrus Tracy deceased, was proved and is now approved and allowed by us, and the said testator at or immediately previous to his death being an inhabitant of or having left assets, which then were or have since come within the said County of Oswego, by reason whereof the proving and registering of the said will and granting administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said testator and also the auditing, allowing and finally discharging the account thereof do belong unto the County Judge of the said County: The administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased and in any way concerning his will, is granted unto Esther Tracy the executrix in the said will, and she having first taken and subscribed an oath or affirmation faithfully and honestly to discharge the duties of such executrix, she is hereby requiring you to make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said testator within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the County of Oswego within three months from the date of these presents: And if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been so made shall come to your possession or knowledge, to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof and return the same within two months after the discovery thereof and also to render a just and true account of the administration when the same shall be required.
