

The People of the State of New York, To Lucy Jennings and David Jennings - and greeting:

Thomas Channing Jennings is alleged, lately died intestate, being at or immediately previous to his death in possession of or having left effects which there were or have since come into the hands of you, by means whereof the ordinary and granting out administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of which the said intestate died possessed, and also the settling allowing and final discharging the account thereof, do belong unto our County Judge of the County of Orange: And our being desirous that the goods, chattels and credits of the said intestate shall be well and faithfully administered, applied and disposed of, do hereby and unto you the said Lucy Jennings and David Jennings full power by these presents to ascertain and finally dispose of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, receive monies and to pay the debts which unto the said intestate, whether living and at the time of his death did belong, and to pay the debts which the said intestate did owe, as far as such goods, chattels and credits will thereto extend and the law upon being required you to make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said intestate, within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the County of Orange, within three months from the date of these presents, and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory, that shall have been made shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner, a true and perfect inventory thereof within two months after the discovery thereof.

And we do by these presents, separate ourselves and appoint you the said Lucy Jennings & David Jennings Administrators of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits which unto the said Channing Jennings deceased.

Know ye, that at Pulaski village in the County of Orange on the thirteenth day of September A.D. 1851 Obed H. Whitney County Judge of our said County, that last will and testament of Ebenezer Barker deceased, was found and is now approved and allowed by us: And that said testator at or immediately previous to his death being an inhabitant of, or having left effects which there were or have since come within the said County of Orange by reason whereof, the granting and executing of the said will and granting administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said testator and also the settling allowing and final discharging the account thereof do belong unto the County Judge of the said County: The administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased and in any way concerning his will, do granted unto Ebenezer Barker & David Handwell the executors in the said will named, they being first taken and subscribed on oath or affirmation quietly and honestly to discharge the duties of such executors, being required you to make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said testator within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof, to our County Judge of the County of Orange within three months from the date of these presents; and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory that shall have been made shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof, and return the same within two months after the discovery thereof, and also to make a just and true account of the administration time when the same is required.
