

The People of the State of New York, To Owen Sullivan in the right and behalf of his wife Sarah greeting: Whereas Abigail Smith is alleged, lately deceased, to have been at an immediately previous to her death an inhabitant of or having left assets which then were her own some within the county of Orange, by an order of the said court and granting administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of which the said intestate died possessed, and also the auditing allowing and final discharging the account thereof do belong unto our County Judge of the county of Orange, and we being desirous that the goods, chattels and credits of the said intestate shall be well and faithfully administered, applied and disposed of, We Grant unto you the said Owen Sullivan in the right aforesaid full power by these presents to administer and faithfully dispose of all and singular the said Goods Chattels and Credits, to ask demand men or such manner the debts which unto the said intestate belonged and at the time of her death did belong, and to pay the debts which the said intestate did owe as far as such goods chattels and credits will thereto extend and the law require, hereby requiring you to make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said intestate within a reasonable time and return a duplicate thereof to our County Judge of the county of Orange within three months from the date of these presents, and if further personal property or assets of any kind not mentioned in any inventory, that shall hereafter be made shall come to your possession or knowledge to make or cause to be made in like manner a true and perfect inventory thereof, and return the same within two months after discovery thereof, and also to render a just and true account of the administration when thereunto required.
