the application of George Van Dusen  
to appear before the Surrogate of Oswego  
County for a final settlement of his  
accounts as guardian aforesaid, and  
on the return day thereof, the said  
guardian having appeared by Sam-  
H. Wandell his attorney, and the  
said George Van Dusen having ap-  
peared by James Gallagher his attor-  
ney, and the said guardian having duly  
filed his accounts together with the vouchers  
in support thereof, and said George Van Dusen  
having duly filed his objections to said  
account, and said matter having been duly  
referred to F. H. David Esq. for hearing and de-  
termination according to the statute.

And said referee having heard the proof
