Second I hereby appoint my husband Joseph J. Draper the sole executor of this my last will & testament and empower him to sell & give a full and sufficient title to the said estate belonging to Julia A. & Karlau P. Draper and to maintain the same in a proper & eligible situation and to hold a lease & enjoy the use of the same during his natural life. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 14<sup>th</sup> Day of Sept. 1863.

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF Gilbert Goodwin Deceased.

BE IT REMEMBERED, That heretofore, to wit: on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty five in the LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of late of the Town of Palmyra in the County of Oswego deceased, appeared in open Court, before the Surrogate of the County of Oswego and made application to have the said LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT which relates to both Real and Personal Estate proved; and on such application, the said Surrogate did accredit by satisfactory evidence who were the heirs at law and next of kin of the said testator, and their respective residences.

and said Surrogate did thereupon cause a Citation in due form of law, directed to the heirs at law, and next of kin by their respective names, stating their respective places of residence, requiring them to appear before said Surrogate at his Office in said County, on the 19 day of July A. D. 1865 to attend the Probate of said Will.

And afterwards to wit: on the 19 day of July A. D. 1865 satisfactory evidence by affidavit, was produced and presented to said Surrogate, of the due service of said Citation in the mode prescribed by law; and on that day so appearing to oppose the Probate of said Will, such proceedings were thereupon had in said Court afterwards, that the said Surrogate took the oath of said Will in substance set forth, upon this 19 day of July A. D. 1865 and he thereupon adjudged the said Will to be a valid Will of Real and Personal Estate, and the proofs thereof to be sufficient, which said LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, is as follows, that is to say:
