BE IT REMEMBERED, That before to wit, on the 4 day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and 73 Execut named in the LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of William King late of the City of Oswego in the County of Oswego deceased, appeared in open Court, before the Surrogate of the County of Oswego and made application to have the said LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT which relates to both Real and Personal Estate proved; and on such application, the said Surrogate did ascertain by satisfactory evidence who were the heirs at law and next of kin of the said testator, and their respective residences,

and said Surrogate did thereupon issue a Citation in due form of law, directed to the heirs at law, and next of kin by their respective names, stating their respective places of residence requiring them to appear before said Surrogate at Oswego in office in the village of Oswego in said County, on the 17 day of Sept A.
