All the rest and residue of my estate and property of every kind and character and wherever situated of which I may be seized and possessed, or be in any wise entitled to, or interested in; I give, devise, and bequeath as follows - one third to Doctor Carrington, M. D. of Cawago New York, and the other two thirds thereof, to Edwin Allen of Cawago New York. And lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint the said Edwin Allen to be executor of this my last will and Testament.
