

I, Michael Connor of the town of Scitola County of
 Oswego and State of New York, aged 65 years being of sound
 mind and memory, do make, ordain, publish and declare
 this to be my last Will and Testament, that is to say:

- 1st I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter Mary Bailey the
 sum of \$25 to be hers absolutely forever
- 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Peter Connor \$100 to be
 his absolutely forever
- 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter, Catherine Connor
 \$50 to be hers absolutely forever
- 4th I give and bequeath to my son William Connor \$100 to
 be his absolutely forever
- 5th I give and bequeath to my son Francis Connor \$25 to be
 his absolutely forever
- 6th I give bequeath and devise to my son James Connor all
 those parts and parcels of land now owned by me and ded-
 id to me by George C. Stowers one parcel deeded to me in 1854
 the other in 1875 being the south part of my home farm
- 7th I give bequeath and devise to my son Michael Connor all
 the residue of my home farm situate in the town of Scitola
 and not devised to James Connor in Section 6 of this my
 last will and testament being parts of lots No 24-30-29 in
 the 18th township of Scitola Patent. This land is devised to
 Michael Connor subject to the payment of the legacies men-
 tioned in sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this my last will and
 testament.

Lastly I give and bequeath to my son James Connor afore-
 said four cows and half the huff that may be owned
 by me at the time of my death, all the residue of my
 personal property of whatever kind or nature I give and
 bequeath to my son Michael Connor aforeaid to be his
 absolutely forever.

Likewise, I make constitute and appoint James
 Bailey of the town of Scitola county of Oswego and State of
 New York to be executor of this my last Will and Testament
 hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name
 and affixed my seal, the 27 day of August in the year of
 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine.

 late of the town of Constantia in the County of Oswego deceased, appeared in
 open Court, before the Surrogate of the County of Oswego and made application to have the said LAST WILL AND
 TESTAMENT which relates to both Real and Personal Estate proved; and on such application,
 the said Surrogate did ascertain by satisfactory evidence who were the heirs at law, and next of kin of the said
 testator, and their respective residences,

and said Surrogate did thereupon issue a Citation in due form of law, directed to the heirs at law, and next of kin
 by their respective names, stating their respective places of residence
 requiring them to appear before said Surrogate at his office
 in the village of Phoenix in the said County, on the 17th day of March A. D. 1884
 to attend the Probate of said Will,

And afterwards to wit: on the 17th day of March A. D. 1884 satisfactory evidence by affidavit,
 was produced and presented to said Surrogate, of the due service of said Citation in the mode prescribed by law; and on that day no one
 appearing to oppose the Probate of such Will such proceedings was thereupon had in said Court afterwards, that the
 said Surrogate took the proofs of said Will hereinafter set forth, upon this 17th
 day of March A. D. 1884 and he thereupon adjudged the said Will to be a
