I order give and bequeath unto my three youngest sons all my right title and interests to the Widows thirds, or rights of dower in the real estate, at her death, the same to be divided between them equally, all to share in the same and share equal rights. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint William McKim and John Severian, executors, of this my last Will and Testament, hereby expressly revoking all former Wills by me made and seal at New Haven this 16th day of April in the year 1834.
