

Be it remembered that heretofore to wit, on the 18th day of January A.D. 1850. Sally Brewster Chief Justice & Justice, named in the last will and testament of Abel Brewster late of Parish in Oswego County, deceased, appeared in open court before A. Whitney County Judge of Oswego County and made application to have said will which relates to both real and personal estate proved: and on such application the said Judge did ascertain by satisfactory evidence who were the widow heirs and next of kin of said testator & their respective residences. And said Judge did thereupon issue a citation in due form of law directed to the said widow heirs and next of kin, by their respective names, stating their respective residences, requiring them to appear in this court, before said Judge at his office in session on the 28th day of January, then instant, and attend the probate of said will. And afterwards to wit on the said 28th day of January, satisfactory evidence was produced and presented to said Judge of the service of the said citation in the mode prescribed by law. And on that day was one appearing to oppose. Such proceedings were thereupon had afterwards that the County Judge took the proof of the said will hereinafter set forth upon this 28th day of January A.D. 1850. and in witness whereof the said will to be a valid will of real and personal estate, and the proofs thereof to be sufficient, which said last will and testament and proof are as follows, to wit: to say:

In the name of God amen. I Abel Brewster of the town of Parish, in the county of Oswego & State of New York of the age of forty four years, and being of sound mind and memory, do make public and declare this my last will and testament in the manner following, that is to say:

First: I give and bequeath to my wife Sally Brewster all the personal property, now on the premises hereinafter described consisting of cows, young cattle sheep, hogs, farming utensils &c. &c.

Second: I give and devise to my wife Sally Brewster her heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land, being part of lot number nineteen (19) as conveyed by

Elijah Blake in the year 1801, situated in township number twentythree (23) in Sarah's patent in Oswego County, and State of New York, described as follows, that is to say, Beginning at the south east corner of said lot 19 at a stake twelve links north west of a hick tree cornered & numbered 19.20 running thence north twentyone degrees east along the east line of said lot fourteen chains six links to the south east corner of forty one acres, part of said lot. Thence under contract to Lony Thayer, thence N. 69° W. along the south line of said Lony Thayer forty one acres, twenty eight chains seven links to the north east corner of fourteen acres, & one quarter of an acre, part of said lot, conveyed by and dated 13th instant to John Becker, thence south twelve degrees west, along the east line of the said John Becker 14 1/2 acres, fourteen chains twenty six links to the south line of said lot, being the said John Becker's south east corner thence south sixty nine degrees east, along south line of said lot twenty six chains twenty five links to the place of beginning containing thirty five acres & three quarters of an acre more or less, together with all the hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining to have and to hold the premises above described to the said Sally Brewster her heirs & assigns forever.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine.

Abel Brewster Test.

The above instrument consisting of one sheet was at the date thereof declared to us by Abel Brewster the testator therein mentioned to be his last will and testament and he at the same time acknowledged to us and each of us that he had signed and sealed the same and we thereupon at his request & in his presence, and in the presence of each other signed our names thereto as attesting witnesses:
