 Present the preceding last will & testament of Abel Bryson deceased as well as a will, real and personal estate together with the proofs taken in the Ozark county surrogate's court, relating to the said last will and testament, which record, is hereby signed and certified, by me pursuant to the provisions of the Revised Statutes this 28th day of January in the year A.D. 1850.

But remembers, that having to wit, on the 10th day of January 1850, Justin & Johnny sole Executors of the last will and testament of Antoine Jany, late of Ozark deceased appeared in open court before Cora H. Whitney County Judge of Ozark County, said made application to have said last will and testament proved; and on such application the said Judge did ascertain by satisfactory evidence who were the widow heirs and next of kin of the said testator and their respective residences, and some of them appearing before me having no general guardian or special guardian was appointed in due form of law to take care of the interests of the said minors in the matter of proving said will by an order entered for that purpose by said Judge; and said Judge did thereupon issue a citation according to law directed to the said widow, heirs and next of kin by their respective names stating their respective places of residence requiring them to appear in this court at the Ozark Hotel in the city of Ozark, on the 29th day of January then instant and attend to the probate of said will, and afterwards to wit on the said 29th day of January satisfactory evidence was produced and presented to said Judge by affidavit of the service of the said citation in the mode prescribed by law, and on that day no one appearing to oppose such proceedings, whereupon and afterwards that the County Judge took the proof of the said will hereunto set forth in the said will at Ozark A.D. 1850.

and the said Judge adjudged the said will to be a valid will of real and personal estate to the proofs thereof to be sufficient, which said will and proofs are as follows to wit:

The last will and testament of Antoine Jany of the town of Ozark County of Ozark, Antoine Jany considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament as follows: First, I will and bequeath unto my wife Catharine the premises where I now live consisting of about 1/4 and a quarter acres being the same land purchased by me of William Hawley by deed dated the 8th day of September 1834 and I hereby suggest to my said wife that she by will or otherwise make such disposition of said property hereby bequeathed to her as shall be just and fair to my daughter Pauline and the said Antoine Jany's wife is made subject to the support and maintenance of the said Pauline during the life of my said wife;

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Justin A. the farm on which he now lives, being the land conveyed to me by Warren Coates by deed dated July 12, 1843 containing about forty eight acres of land lying in the town of Ozark.

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Catharine Jany wife of Joseph Jardy the premises where the said Joseph Jardy and Catharine his wife now live being in the town of Ozark of one acre and being the same premises conveyed to me by William Ducker & wife by deed recorded in the Clerk's office of Ozark County May 31, 1845 in Book 142 of deeds pages 179 180 & 181 and I hereby will and bequeath to my said wife Catharine all the household furniture and all the personal property now on the premises aforesaid the farm which I now occupy, and I hereby appoint my son Justin A. sole Executor of this my last will and testament.
