Do it remembered that heretofore to wit on the 24th day of December A.D. 1849 George Kingsbury a lawyer and division named in the last will and testament of William Kingsbury late of Orange County deceased, came in open court before C. H. Whiting County Judge of said county and made application to have the said last will and testament which relates to both real and personal estate proved: And on such application the said Judge did as certain by satisfactory evidence was given the heirs or next of kin of the said deceased and one of them appearing to be a minor, a special guardian was appointed in due form of law to take care of the interest of said minor in the matter of proving said will, by an order entered for that purpose by said Judge, and said Judge did thereupon issue a citation according to law directed to the said heirs and next of kin and special guardian by their respective names, relating their respective claims of interest or possession therein to appear in this court, before the County Judge of Orange County, at his office in Orange on the 25th day of February then next and attend the probate of said will and documents

as such on the said 25th day of February satisfactory evidence was produced & presented by affidavit to said Judge of the terms of the said citation in the mode prescribed by law, and on that day no one appearing to oppose such proceedings, and thereupon said Judge did thereupon issue a citation to the proof of the said will to be made at such place upon this county on the day of February A.D. 1850 and he adjudged the said will to be a valid will of real and personal estate and the proofs thereof to be sufficient which said will and proofs are as follows: viz:

I know all men that I William Kingsbury of the town of Naples in the County of Orange and State of New York of the age of twenty six years and being of sound mind and memory, do make public, and declare this my last will and testament in the manner of following that is to say,

I give devise and bequeath unto my brother George Kingsbury, Joseph Kingsbury, James Kingsbury, and Joshua Kingsbury, their heirs and assigns all my real Estate, consisting of my right and interest in the farm situate in the town of Naples, which my father owned at his death and of which he died seized of about fifty acres, and consisting also of my title and interest in the farm in said town, owned by me and my brother George Kingsbury as tenants in common. And all my said real Estate above mentioned to be divided between my said brothers equally, share and share alike.

In relation to my personal property, I give and bequeath to Charity Smith for office labor done and attention to me in my sickness the sum of fifteen dollars, (\$15.00).

I give and bequeath to my brother George Kingsbury the sum of thirty dollars that sum having been paid by him on a joint mortgage against both of us on the farm we own together, and this sum of thirty dollars is to discharge that debt due him from me. I also give and bequeath to my said brother George Kingsbury the further sum of fifty dollars, to pay him for his labor on our joint account since my sickness, and so long as I shall continue sick and which sum of fifty dollars if paid to him is to be in full payment of that debt due him from me.

All the net residue, and remainder of my personal property and estate (after paying the said sum of fifteen, thirty and fifty dollars above named and bequeathed) I give and bequeath unto my said brothers George Kingsbury, Joseph Kingsbury, James Kingsbury, and Joshua Kingsbury to be equally divided between them share and share alike, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
