 to both real and personal estate, duly proved. And on such application
 the said County Judge did ascertain by satisfactory evidence who were the widow

 to be minors, having no general guardian within this State, a special guardian
 was appointed, in due form of law, to take care of the interests of the said minor
 in the matter of proving said will, by an order entered for that purpose by
 said County Judge, and said County Judge did thereupon issue a citation in

 guardian, by them respectively named, stating their respective places of residence
