 Third I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Eliza the sum of fifty dollars to be paid to her at any time her mother, my said wife may be disposed to pay the same.

Fourth after the death of my said wife Elizabeth, I direct and order that all of my said estate both real and personal shall then be divided equally share and portion alike to all of my children, now living and hereafter named after first reserving therefrom & paying to William Kelly Whitney my grandson the sum of one hundred dollars. If he shall then be living, in case he shall not then be living then all of my said estate shall then be equally divided share and portion alike, to my sons Sidney Hammond, Isaac Porter Hammond, Nathaniel Hammond, and David Prosper Hammond and to my daughter Elizabeth Eliza Hammond, and Phoebe Gurris Binoid.

Fifth I hereby appoint my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Hammond, and my dear brother John P. Hammond to act as my Executors, in executing & carrying out this my last will & testament.
