Richard Norton Deceased.

Be it Remembered, That Richard Norton, to wit: on the nineteenth day
of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
fifty seven John C. Dutton

an Executor named in the Last Will and Testament

of Richard Norton late of the
village of Callton in the County of Columbia
deceased, appeared in open Court, before the Surrogate of the County of Columbia
and made application to have the said LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

of which relates to both real and personal
estate proved; and on such application the said Surrogate did ascertain by satisfactory
evidence who were the widow heirs at law and next of kin of the said
testator, and their respective residences, and some of them appearing to be
minors having no general guardian residing within
the State of New York, a special guardian was
appointed in due form of law, to take care of
their interests in the matter of proving the said
will, by an order entered for that purpose
by said Surrogate.

Special
and said Surrogate did thereupon issue a Citation in due form of law, directed to the
said widow heirs at law, and next of kin and special
guardian by their respective names, stating their respective places
of residence
requiring them to appear before said Surrogate at the Surrogate's Office in the
village of Callton in said County, on the sixth
day of October A. D. 1858, to attend the Probate of said Will
and on that day the petitioner appeared by his
counsel J. H. Deane and no other persons
party appearing on motion of said counsel
let the petitioner, the matter was adjourned
until October 20th inst.

And afterwards to wit: on the 20th day of October
A. D. 1858, satisfactory evidence by affidavit, was produced and presented to said
Surrogate, of the due service of said Citation in the form prescribed by law; and on that
day no one appearing to oppose the Probate of such Will. Special
proceedings were thereupon had in said Court after which the said Surrogate took the
proof of said Will hereinafter set forth, upon this
20th day of October A. D. 1858, and he
thereupon adjudged, the said Will to be a valid Will
of real and personal Estate, and the proofs thereof to be
sufficient, which said Last Will and Testament,
