

In the year of our Lord, 1811,

I, John Hartshorn, of the town of Mexico, county of Orange and state of New York, being, male, sane, of legal age and perfect mind and memory, do make and publish, this my last will and testament in manner and form following,

That is to say, First, I give and bequeath all my wearing apparel to my two sons Cyrus V. Hartshorn and Byron Hartshorn to be divided equally between them. Second, I give and bequeath to my grandson, John V. Hartshorn, a large silver Spoon which I received from my mother. Third, I give and bequeath the use of all my real and personal estate during his natural life to my wife Lucy and after her decease it is my will that all which remains of my estate both real and personal shall be divided equally between my two sons Cyrus V. Hartshorn and Byron Hartshorn they to share alike.

And further it is my will that all the surplus funds which remain after paying all my debts and personal liabilities shall when collected be loaned to my son Cyrus V. Hartshorn the interest to be paid annually to his mother my wife during his natural life and after her death these funds shall be charged to him in the settlement of the estate.

Lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Lucy and my two sons Cyrus V. and Byron Hartshorn, as sole executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six.
