

Drawn my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping and believing in His merciful and loving Father through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, and my body I bequeath to the earth, to be buried at the discretion of my Executors herein after named; And my worldly estate I give and devise as follows: First I give and bequeath unto my sister Lucinda, relict of Charles Supper late of Cayuga County, (deceased) Fifty Dollars, as an equivalent for services rendered me and my family in my former sickness. I give and bequeath unto my dear Sister Salmon Shaver, One Hundred Dollars, Also to my Sister Sarah, relict of Horace Baker late of Cayuga County, One Hundred Dollars. Also I give and bequeath unto my much respected Cousin Mrs. Annah wife of Marks A. Coon, of the Town of Lince, County of Oneida, Fifty Dollars as an acknowledgment of her very kind help, services and attention rendered me in my sickness when lying in Lince, Lewis County, and delay of which I wish her to give to her Mother Elizabeth Ryan, and her Daughter Elizabeth yet living, being named after my dear son Byron, deceased. After my Debt, and those of my deceased Husband, Estate, and expenses for attendance, help, and assistance medical and other attendance during my present sickness, and my funeral charges are paid, and after and divided, that then my personal and household effects shall be equally divided among my sister named as follows to wit: Maria, wife of John Hamilton of Chenango Co. N.Y. Helen, relict of Dr. Joseph Johnson late of Oneida Co. N.Y. Sarah, relict of Horace Baker late of Cayuga Co. N.Y. Polly, wife of George C. Wheeler of Yates Co. N.Y. and Lucinda, relict of Charles Supper late of Cayuga Co. N.Y. share and share alike. The aforesaid division is to be made upon the following conditions, and each to have their equal share provided however that all do, and shall, attend in person (unless prevented on account of sickness) at my last place of residence in Westmore Cayuga Co. after my decease, having had reasonable notice of such meeting, and then and there shall make such equal division of the aforesaid effects, as to them shall appear just and right, and in case any of the aforesaid Sisters shall neglect or refuse to attend such meeting, then and in such case such non-attending Sister or Sisters shall lose or forfeit their share or shares and they that is their shares shall be divided equally among the other Sister or Sisters attending; In regard to the farm Willed to me by my late Husband, being the S. West quarter part of Lot number thirty six (35) Township No 12 of Seneca Patent, containing 37 acres of land, I Will ordain and direct that the same be sold, together with the appurtenances by my Executors either by Auction or private sale, and from the avails or monies accruing therefrom to pay the legacies aforesaid, and the surplus of any share shall be remaining, then and in such case such balance or surplus shall be equally divided among my aforesaid Sisters. Also my desire is and I will, Order and direct that my Executors procure a plain

set of Tomb Stones for my Mother and to be put up at her Grave also that they procure another set of plain Tomb Stones, to wit, a single set with double signification for my deceased husband and myself, and my extraordinary Burial or sepulchre, to be erected at my grave, the cost or expense of which stones to be paid out of the monies arising from the sale of the aforesaid farm if there should not be any unappropriated money left; And all other personal property forming parts of my estate in name or nature whatsoever and I will order direct to be sold and the avails to be equally divided among my aforesaid Sisters; And lastly I finally I hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint David Spencer and Philip Rice of Westmore Cayuga Co. Executors of this my last Will and Testament consisting of one sheet hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
