Be it Remembered, That, heretofore, to wit: on the 1st day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty two

Richard Smith named in the Last Will and Testament of Richard Smith late of the Town of Mexico in the County of Orange and State of New York deceased, appeared in open Court, before the Surrogate of the County of Orange and made application to have the said Last Will and Testament, which relates to both Real and Personal Estate, opened: and on such application the said Surrogate did ascertain, by satisfactory evidence, who were the heirs at law and next of kin of the said testator, and their respective residences.

and said Surrogate did thereupon issue a Citation in due form of law, directed to the heirs at law and next of kin of the said testator, by their respective names, stating their respective places of residence, and requiring them to appear before said Surrogate at his office in the County of Orange, on the 23rd day of June A.D. 1862, to attend the Probate of said Will.

And afterwards, to wit: on the 22nd day of June A.D. 1862 satisfactory evidence by affidavit was produced and presented to said Surrogate, of the due service of said Citations in the mode prescribed by law, and on that day, no one appearing to oppose the Probate of such Will, and proceedings were thereupon had in said Court, afterwards, that the said Surrogate took the oaths of said Will hereinafter set forth, upon this 22nd day of June A.D. 1862, and he thereupon adjudged the said Will to be a valid Will of Real and Personal Estate, and the proof thereof to be sufficient, which said Last Will and Testament, and proof, are as follows, that is to say:

Richard Smith of the Town of Mexico County of Orange and State of New York of the age of forty seven years and being of sound mind and memory do make public and declare this my Last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say, That I give and bequeath to my son John G.
