

The same shall when the said George Miller now resides in Parish
 George County being and continuing until the death of said together
 with the inheritance here and being given and during her natural
 life enjoyed and in case the said Miller shall or shall marry
 again then and in that case the said Miller is to have but one third
 of the property above mentioned to have and to hold the same for and
 during her natural life.

Also I give and bequeath to my wife Ellen & all my personal property
 except what is herein before mentioned and conveyed by virtue of this
 instrument and at her death that my the said Ellen shall marry again
 and cease to be my wife should she marry again then and in that case
 the two thirds of my the said estate above mentioned I give and bequeath
 to my heirs to have and to hold the same to their heirs and I
 give and bequeath to my sons the two thirds of the personal
 property above mentioned to have and to hold the same my wife Ellen & shall marry
 again.

I give bequeath and direct that my respected father and mother
 have the use and enjoyment of seven acres of land where they now
 reside in the said Parish of Parish being located in the south end of forty
 three acres of land which is parallel with the water line of said lot for
 and during their or either of their natural lives.

I give and bequeath to my daughter William A. Miller the remainder
 of the above mentioned forty three acres and at the decease of my
 father and mother both of them I give and bequeath the same
 undivided seven acres of land being a part of the forty three acres
 forty three acres of land to have and to hold the same and wife's heirs
 to have and to hold the same to have and to hold the same and wife's heirs
 of the said Miller conveyed by virtue of this instrument to take effect
 the said Miller arrives to the age of fifteen years.

I do also give and bequeath to my daughter William A. Miller as
 executrix of her father's estate all of my personal property at my death.

I do also give and bequeath to my son George A. Miller one hundred
 dollars out of my personal property at my death.

I hereby appoint Ellen & Miller my executor and hereby ratify and
 confirm my will and testament in that all done and former with
 by me made.
