### NUT CAKE

3 tsp. Baking powder  
3 cups flour  
1/2 tsp. baking soda  
pinch of salt  
1 1/2 cups sugar  
2 heaping tbs. butter  
2 eggs  
1/4 to 1 cup milk  
1 cup chopped walnuts  
Mix butter and sugar. Add 1 egg at a time, mix well. Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with milk. Add chopped walnuts. Pour

into tube pan and bake in moderate oven for about 30 minutes. The following isn't edible, but it's great for the children to play with.

### PLAY DOUGH

1 cup flour  
1/2 cup salt  
3 tsp. alum  
1/4 cup water  
Mix well. Add more water if needed. Add 1 or 2 drops of food coloring to tint.

CARMEL — All persons who bought anti-biotics (aureomycin, terramycin and tetracycline-products) between 1954 and 1966 are notified that they may be entitled to a refund as the result of the terms of settlement of anti-trust actions.

Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz has asked the president of Putnam County Bar Association, Robert L. Smith, to inform the people of this area that claims may be filed, not later than August 16, with the Clerk of the United States District Court, P.O. Box 734, Bronx, New York, 19451. The claim must state the total

dollar value of the purchases and the name and address of the drug-store where such purchases were made.
