ALL OF THE CZAR'S ships that got away from Port Arthur are now out of service, the cruiser Diana in the French harbor of Saigon being the last to be disarmed. A curious story has come from Tsing-Tau in regard to the battleship Czarevitch, which was the flagship during the sortie of August 10.

ANOTHER RUSSIAN LOAN.

Only a few months ago Russia borrowed over \$150,000,000 in France. Therefore the announcement that she is now negotiating with German bankers for a loan of \$250,000,000 is a matter of surprise to those not informed as to Russian finances.

The Russian national debt, which is approximately \$3,300,000,000, is more widely diffused than that of any other nation. Most of it is in the form of 4 per cent. loans.

The interest on \$2,500,000,000 worth of bonds, at the average rate of 4 per cent., would amount to \$100,000,000. Russia has to provide for the payment of this amount of interest to foreigners every year.

This was only a little more than enough to meet the next quarterly interest payments, which amounted to \$25,000,000. The Russian government could have replenished its foreign resources by exporting gold from its supply at St. Petersburg, but preferred to borrow money abroad and a loan for more than \$150,000,000 was floated in Paris.

The loan floated in Paris largely increased Russia's balances abroad. Since then one quarterly interest payment has fallen due and been paid, and another quarterly interest payment will shortly fall due. In addition, large purchases of war supplies have been made. The result is that Russia's foreign balance has again begun to dwindle.

WANTS \$15,000 DAMAGES.

Niles Woman Files Managers of Steamer Around it for Her Husband's Death.

A dispatch from Syracuse says: "The tragedy which created great excitement at Ontario Beach and other lake resorts about Fair Haven, July 4, 1903, resulting in the drowning of George E. Reed, of Niles, Cayuga county, has for its last echo a negligence action against the managers of the boat Arundell for \$15,000 damages. The sensational manner in which Reed met his death is recounted in the omnipolar, which, after an effort lasting more than six months, was served last Saturday by Attorney Charles L. Wayne, of this city, who appears for the plaintiff. For a long period after the accident, Adelbert R. Rice and Robert Maxwell, the present managers of the Arundell under the will of the former owner, Darlus Cole, could not be found, so the action hung fire until the return of the trustees of the Cole estate into New York.
