court on his confession. As there will be no use for jury or witness the proceedings will be viewed only by counsel. The accused may be the district attorney, a few clerks and a dozen newspaper men.

Upon his appearance in the little cage in the middle of the court room Richeson's counsel will give formal notice to the court of the desire of their client to change his plea of not guilty.

Judge Sanderson then will confirm that statement by asking the prisoner directly if he desires to change his plea. Upon learning from Richeson that such is his intention, Clerk John P. Maunting will read the indictment ending with the words: "What say you now to the indictment?"

Expected to say "Guilty." Richeson is expected to reply "guilty." It then will lay with the district attorney to move for immediate sentence or ask for a brief delay.

The court may also desire sufficient time to think the matter over before pronouncing sentence of death and fixing the week of the execution. But whatever may be the outcome of the proceedings today, Richeson's ultimate fate is regarded by good lawyers as resting in the court of last appeal in this State, the governor and Council.

Before the Richeson case reaches the State House the attitude of the Executive Council towards capital punishment will be known as the fate of Silas N. Phelps, the Monroe outlaw must be settled within the next 10 days.

Richeson's petition for commutation will come before Governor Foss personally and may be rejected without a hearing by the Council.

The governor may, however, ask the advice of his Council on the advisability of rejecting it and has the power to disregard such advice. But in case he does show such a disposition to give Richeson a chance for life, he cannot order commutation without the consent of a majority of the Council.

One member of that Council, John Quinn of Boston, has expressed himself as opposed to inflicting the death penalty upon Richeson but the other members refused to commit themselves.

Lieutenant Governor Robert Luce spoke strongly in opposition to capital punishment when a member of the Legislature.

Pelletier Sees Foss. District Attorney Pelletier was closeted with Governor Foss at the State house for about half an hour this forenoon.

The district attorney stated that his call had nothing to do with the Richeson case and said that he visited the governor in regard to the appointment of a deputy sheriff. Questioned about the Richeson case, Mr. Pelletier admitted that Governor Foss spoke about it but emphatically denied that the governor asked him to consider a second degree plea by the pastor.

Strike Breakers at Work. Boston, Jan. 3.—In an endeavor to combat the tie-up of steamship freight caused by the strike of longshoremen for an increase in wages about 1,000 strike breakers, said to be the first part of the army of 3,000 men from New York, to fill the places of the strikers, began work today at the wharves under protection of a detail of police.

TROOPS CLASH IN ECUADOR. Battle Near Huigra as Result of Row Over Presidency. Guayaquil, Ecuador, Jan. 3.—A clash occurred today between the two opposing armies in Ecuador. The vanguards of the two forces, one of which has espoused the cause of General Flavio Alfaro, who was to have assumed the presidency of the provisional government proclaimed at Guayaquil by General Pedro Montero on December 28 and the other under the command of General Leonidas Plaza, who has the support of the inhabitants of the capital at Quito as well as the troops stationed there, came into conflict near Huigra. General Plaza's force retired after a brief skirmish.

About 1,500 of the troops from Quito are now encamped at Almal while about 1,000 men from Guayaquil are concentrated at Huigra.

The provisional government of Guayaquil has appointed General Flavio Alfaro commander-in-chief of the army.

General Eloy Alfaro has issued a proclamation tending towards a peaceful solution and proposing that both armies should lay down their arms and elect a civilian as president of the republic. It appears certain that the soldiers from Quito will refuse to accept the proposition. They will, it is said, insist on the election of General Leonidas Plaza.

The United States gunboat Yorktown arrived here from Panama yesterday afternoon.

# A DECREASE OF 550

throughout the State. Its service could be rendered much more effectively if some provision were made requiring all dealers within the State except those holding liquor tax certificates, to file with the Excise department the name of the person and the place of business of each person so engaged in the liquor traffic and providing that every person holding a United States Internal revenue certificate for the sale of liquors, but not holding a State certificate, shall keep books showing a correct record of all purchases and sales, which shall be subject at all times to examination by the State commissioner of excise.

The sale of liquor by a minor under the age of 18 years, if a member of the family of a certificate holder, or the report discusses at length and legislation is urged to stop this condition.

"There would seem to be no good reason," the report says, "why a member of the family of a certificate holder who is under the age of 18 years should be permitted to participate in the traffic when other minors of the same age are expressly forbidden to participate in, or to be, or allowed to remain, where such traffic is carried on. Children of tender age, whether or not they are members of the family of certificate holders, should not be exposed to the conditions which at some time prevail where the traffic is not properly conducted. The dealers will suffer no great inconvenience if deprived of the services of such minors who are members of their family. Happily the cases where such minors are permitted to assist in the traffic are very few. But it seems wise to restrict such labor by a positive statutory amendment."

Newer Excise Licenses. Under the ratio bill passed during the year 1910 the tendency is to reduce the number of excise licenses. The report shows a decrease of 11,609 for the fiscal year 1911 as against the fiscal year 1910, of 308 hotels and 342 saloons. The receipts of the department for the fiscal year 1911 were \$18,319,880.27 as compared to \$18,102,822.19 the previous year. The expenses of the department for the fiscal year of 1911 were \$382,682.28 a decrease, as compared to the previous fiscal year, of \$16,485.46.
