FROM CALIFORNIA AND SOUTH AMERICA.—The steamer Moss Taylor arrived at New York on the 27th with news from San Francisco on the 25th. The steamer Oregon from San Francisco bound for Victoria, struck on a reef on the night of the 31st of July, but subsequently got off unharmed. During the confusion a number of passengers jumped overboard and six were drowned. Names unknown, but little said about Fraser river. The steamer Pacific which left San Francisco for Victoria took but a few passengers. The health of San Francisco never better. Business improving. Provisions still in active demand—Money abundant and collections easy.—The cholera has disappeared from Guatemala. A project for towing vessels through the Straits of Magellan has been submitted to the Chilean Congress. In Peru the general impression was that Castilla would be re-elected President.

POTENTIAL.—A meeting for a union of the opponents of the Administration was held at Oswego on Saturday night last. Speaker Orr at a barbecue given him recently in South Carolina, expressed himself in favor of the re-election of Douglas over Lincoln and against a re-opening of the slave trade. Democracy in South Carolina is more independent than Democracy elsewhere.

They now quote Gerritt Smith to prove that they are not abolitionists and argue consequently they are not friends of freedom. This is a good specimen of Democratic dodging.

The yacht Frolic has been metamorphosed and provided with a sloop rig. With her repairs, her new canvas and new rig, she makes a fine appearance, and looks as though she would do something in a regatta.

Wednesday, the 1st of September will be observed by various cities throughout the United States and Canada, and Great Britain, as a holiday, in honor of the Atlantic cable. Ottawa and Brookville, we understand, will have grand celebrations. The demonstrations will not be so universal as those on the 17th, upon the announcement of the official message.
