

**DP HANGS SELF;  
SICK SOME TIME**

**Jacob Szejd Found Dead By  
Muskrat Trapper Along  
Owasco Outlet**

A Polish displaced person, in ill health for several months, was found dead yesterday, hanging from a tree at the rear of 25 Canoga St. He is Jacob Szejd, 22, of 17 Canoga St.

Coroner Norman L. Woodford found a verdict of suicide—death by hanging.

The body was discovered by George Rosen of 180 Perrine Ave. who was checking the creek bank for muskrat holes for trapping. It was hanging by a clothes line from the limb of a tree, about 14 feet from the ground, only a few feet from Owasco outlet.

Mr. Rosen rushed to the home of Anthony Emmi of 25 Canoga St. where he notified police. Captain Joseph T. Conboy detailed Detectives Lawrence H. Mentillo and John T. Costello to the scene.

Parents of the youth said they saw him last around noon on Saturday. They said he had been sick for some time, and because of that was unemployed.

The family came to this country as displaced persons two years ago. Services were held at 3 p. m. today at the Kowalczyk Funeral Home. The Rev. John Yanchisin officiated.

Burial was in St. Nicholas Cemetery in Half Acre.

**Oakum Smoke Hampers Firemen at Plumbing Shop Blaze**

Dense billows of smoke and hot flames did \$2,500 damage about 9 p. m. Saturday evening on the State St. after sparks from an acetylene torch touched off fire in a pile of oakum. John Castiglione, proprietor, had been working on the first floor of the building, according to Fire Chief Luke J. Bergan, when sparks from his torch apparently



While a group of firemen were busy on the inside of the shop, another group had taken up stations around the outside in the rear of Casty's Plumbing Shop. Several large lines of hose were used to knock down the flames that centered around the stockroom. Some of the men were spraying water from a hose line into the cellar while others used a line on the fire that raged through the stock room on the ground floor level. reached the basement where the oakum was stored. Smoke poured from the material, making it difficult to

reach the roof of the building. Several second and third floor apartment tenants were evacuated as the flames threatened to spread in that direction.

The active fire department force of 70 men and 12 engines, 12 hook and ladder and 12 hose and truck companies were on hand to contain the fire.

Damage was confined mainly to stock and work room in the rear of the building, on the main floor, where boiler were burned in the floor and some stored paint was damaged.

Though the basement was badly charred, little material of value was stored there, according to Chief Bergan.

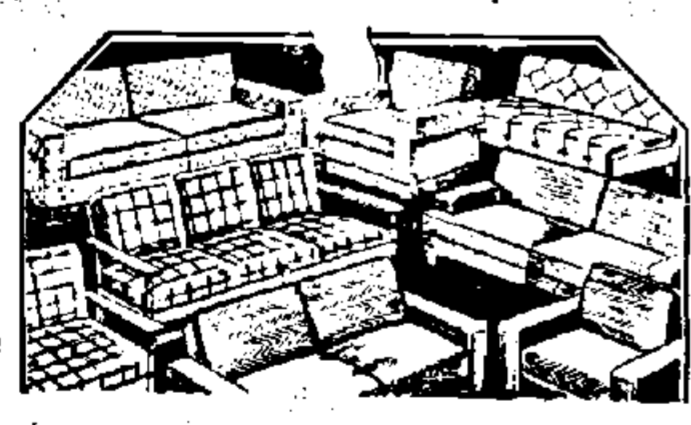
