Hitchcock relished heart operation

LOS ANGELES (AP)—"It was a fascinating experience," said Alfred Hitchcock, relating his recent heart operation with the same relish he uses to tell plots of his new movies.

Two months ago, the famed director underwent a pacemaker implant at UCLA Medical Center.

He is now back in his tastefully furnished office at Universal Studio, working long hours to prepare the script of his new film, which he plans to start shooting in March.

Between script sessions he remarked about the operation and the results that followed.

"The operation took only a day to recover from," he said. "I was six days recovering from an antibiotic I was given."

He said he had been experiencing dizziness last autumn, the result of a heartbeat that had lowered to 45 per minute.

Hitchcock, who maintains a regimen of weekly medical examinations, said his doctors laid him on a table, took their readings and announced, "Well, you need a pacemaker."

"It's really quite a simple operation, with a local anesthetic," he remarked. "They made an incision below the neck and found a vein into which was inserted a wire with an electrode on the end of it; it was extended into the heart."

"The pacemaker was placed under the

skin in front of the shoulder blade. It is the size of an old-fashioned watch, about one and a half inches round and three-eighths inches thick. They hook the wire up to the pacemaker and sew you up.

"They set you at 70 beats a minute. If your heart falls below 70, the pacemaker pulls you up automatically. If your heart goes above 70, the thing pulls it down.

"Once it's in, you don't feel it at all.

"Actually, everyone has a pacemaker in the heart. When it starts to fail, then you can install an artificial one.

"Mine is good for four years before it has to be recharged. The interesting thing is that I could be in Paris during the third year and could phone a number at UCLA, hold the receiver to my skin and they would tell me how the pacemaker was functioning."

Hitchcock said he ran into trouble after the operation because of an antibiotic that cleared his system of all germs, good and bad, resulting colitis, something he said he would not wish on even his blackest movie villains.
