## Sommers scores 30 for St. Michael's

The Wolves host Southern Cayuga Tuesday.

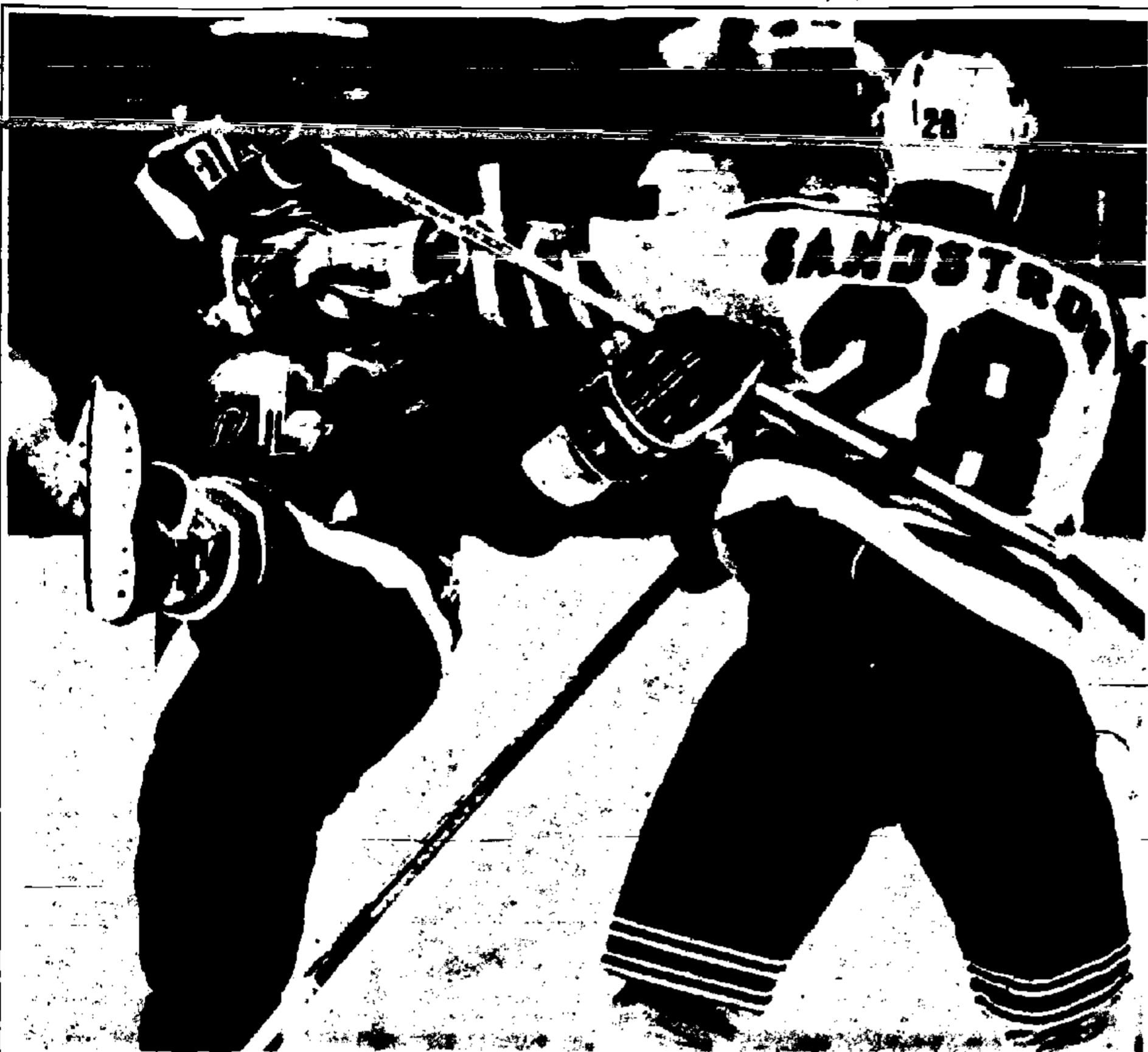
## Becker sweeps Wilander for title

**BERLIN (UPI)** — Teen-age West German Boris Becker defeated Sweden's Mats Wilander in straight sets Sunday to capture the Young Masters Tennis Tournament.

Becker, the Wimbledon champion, knocked off the 21-year-old Wilander, 6-1, 7-6, 6-0, in an hour and 30 minutes before 5,500 spectators to pocket the \$30,000 winner's purse. The Swedish Davis Cup hero received \$20,000.

"In the first and third sets, I never saw him play better," Wilander, the French Open champion, said. "Not against me, anyway. It's not easy to have a tactic when he hits aces all the time."

The 18-year-old Becker, ranked three places below his opponent at sixth in the world, committed few mistakes, despite Wilander's clever baseline game and net strategy. Becker made consistently devastating use of his powerful forehand.

## Vancouver coach blasts Canucks for 'terrible' effort

Vancouver coach Tom Watt put more effort into his comments than his Canucks put into the game.

"I thought it was a terrible, terrible effort," he said Sunday night after Doug Smail and Scott Arniel scored on Winnipeg's first and third shots of the game en route to a 4-0 victory over the Canucks. "The game was over on the first shift. We were bad."

The decision snapped Winnipeg's five-game losing streak, extended Vancouver's skid to four, and left the teams tied for third-place in the Smythe Division.

"We were a disaster both ways," Watt said. "Defensively, we ran around like pregnant foxes in a forest fire. Offensively, we couldn't put the puck in the ocean if we were standing on the pier."

Smail scored into a wide-open Vancouver net

53 seconds into the game, after Tomas Steen pulled goaltender Richard Brodeur to the far side. At 1:40, Arniel scored off Perry Turnbull's rebound to make it 2-0.

At 9:42 of the first period, Ron Wilson's short-handed goal on a perfect setup by Smail increased Winnipeg's lead to 3-0.

Brian Mullen scored the only goal of the second period at 14:48 as he converted Dale Hawerchuk's pass to put the Jets up 4-0.

Winnipeg goaltender Dan Bouchard stopped 20 shots in gaining the shutout.

"The guys protected me very well. Bouchard said, 'When a goaltender gets a shutout, most times it's 95-percent team effort.'"

In other games, Quebec downed the New York Rangers 5-4, Los Angeles nipped Buffalo 3-2, Detroit shaded Toronto 6-5, Edmonton thrashed Calgary 6-3 and Chicago ripped Minnesota 6-2.

**Nordiques 5, Rangers 4**

At New York, John Anderson scored his 200th NHL goal and added an assist as Quebec fought off a comeback for its fourth straight victory. With the triumph, the Nordiques moved into a first-place tie with Montreal for first place in the Adams Division. The Rangers scored four third-period goals.

**Kings 3, Sabres 2**

At Buffalo, Phil Sykes scored the game-

winning goal midway through the second period, leading Los Angeles. Sykes picked up the puck at center ice, skated around defenseman Phil Housley and wristed it over goalie Jacques Cloutier for a 3-1 lead. Mike Foligno and Lindy Ruff scored for Buffalo.

**Red Wings 6, Maple Leafs 5**

At Toronto, Petr Klima scored a goal and added three assists to lead Detroit. With the score tied, 5-5, Klima delivered the game-winner at 13:59 to pull the Red Wings within two points of the Leafs in the Norris Division. Toronto twice rallied from two-goal deficits to tie the score.

**Oilers 8, Flames 3**

At Edmonton, Marty McSorley scored 14 seconds into the game and Grant Fuhr blocked 41 shots to hand Calgary its 10th straight loss, extending its club-record. It marked the Oilers' fifth straight victory and their fifth in five outings against their Alberta "rivals" this season.

At Chicago, Steve Larmer and Denis Savard scored third-period goals a minute apart to give the Black Hawks their fifth straight victory. With the score tied, 2-2, entering the final period, Larmer notched his 14th goal at 4:13 by beating goalie Don Beaupre.
