(Continued from first page) his replies at the investigation by the Interstate Commerce Commission. "He stood on a rising market."

Power of the Commission. "And I want to say also," continued Mr. Milburn, "that I find myself in about all the trouble I care to confront when I attempt to try my case out before the law as it exists today."

Mr. Milburn asserted that the Union Pacific had the legal right to purchase stock in other railroads without the right to buy Illinois Central stock from Mr. Harriman and Mr. Harriman had the legal right to sell it.

Underlying the whole case, however, Mr. Milburn said, is the fundamental right of an individual protected in his liberty of action by the Constitution of the United States. The liberties of the individual can only be interfered with by due process of law and for the common good.
