

# ELKS TO OBSERVE 27TH BIRTHDAY TOMORROW EVE.

## Annual Installation and Visit of High Chiefs Also Planned.

Observance of the 27th anniversary of the founding of the lodge, the annual installation of officers together with the visitation of high officers of the organization from out of town will make up a page in the annals of local Elksdom when the members of Auburn Lodge of Elks assemble for their regular semi-monthly meeting tomorrow evening. 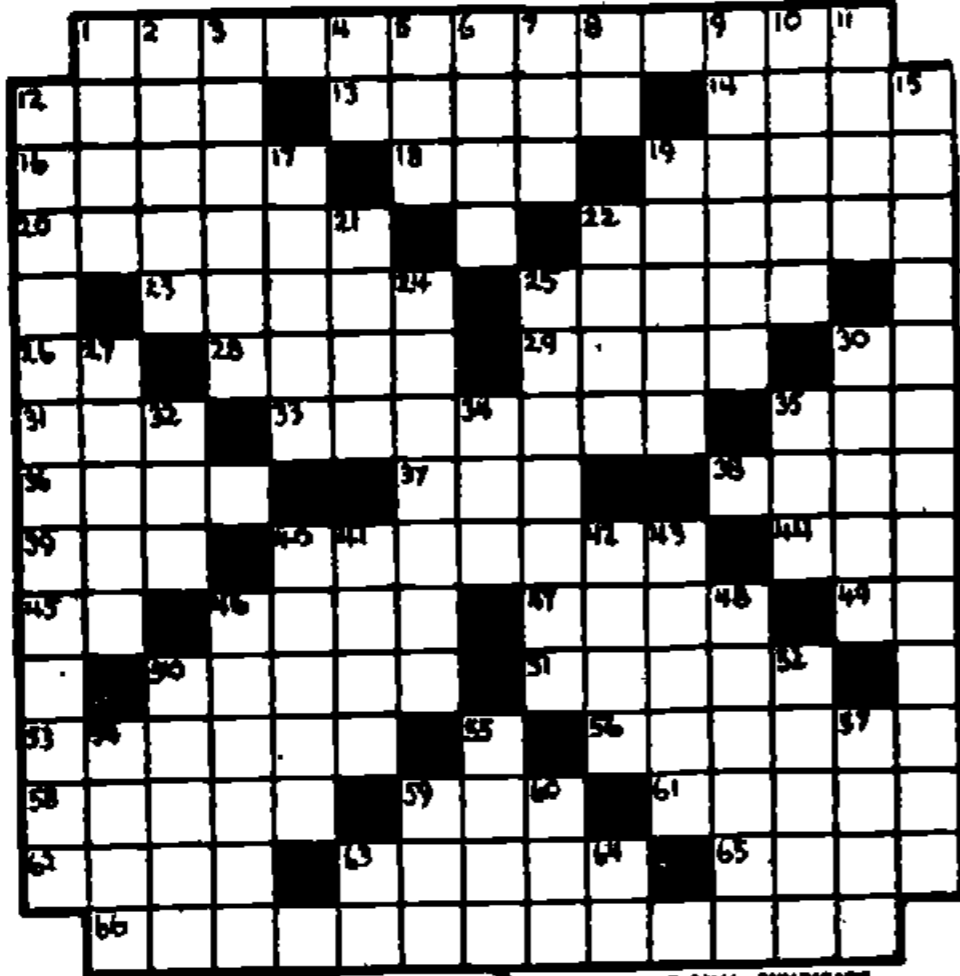

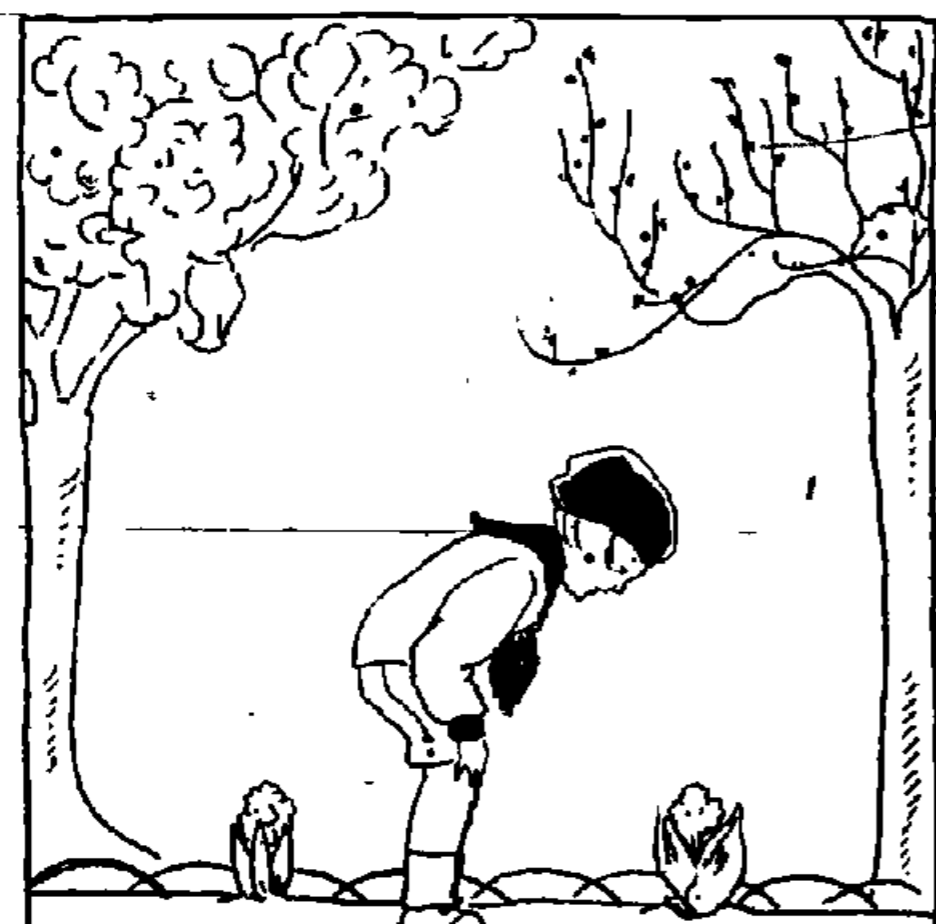

## FORMER AUBURN CONVICTS NABBED

The increasing vigilance of New York's executive forces is seen by the recent Whittemore roundup, when "The Kandy Kid" as he is known in the underworld, and his gang were brought to justice. On top of this coup, another capture, how was dealt Monday by the police at the underworld machine which has been raising havoc of late in New York City.

Six men were arrested in a raid which is described by Inspector Coughlin of the New York Police Force as the most important since the Whittemore roundup. Two of the men, are former Auburn Prison convicts. They are Henry Walton, 38, alleged leader of the gang, and Adolph Abraham, 32, known to the police as "Dutch Adolph." It is alleged they figured in the robbery of a card game in West Forty-Sixth Street, and also police claim evidence enough to connect each of the prisoners, with numerous wholesale robberies and blackmail exploits.
