**Convenience Aids Bread-Making**

Washington.—(AP)—The excellence of home-made bread may depend on the housewife's ability to do the right thing at the right time. Experts say such an attainment is supported by a proper and sufficient array of materials and ingredients. There are several processes by which bread may be made choice depending on convenience and personal taste. Those experienced in the art know by the "feel" of the dough when enough flour has been added and about how long it should be kneaded. Temperature is as important as the recipe. It is advised that the oven register from 400 to 415 degrees and that the temperature be lowered after 20 minutes. The bread should be cooled on a rack and not covered while warm. For making 2 1/2 pounds of bread the Bureau of Home Economics suggests the proportion of ingredients be 2 1/2 pounds (or quarts) of sifted hard-wheat flour, 2 1/2 cups of liquid (milk, water, potato water, or a combination of both), 4 teaspoons salt, 2 tablespoons sugar, 2 tablespoons fat and 1 ounce (2 cakes) yeast.
