Report of the Board of Visitors of West Point. The unanimous report of the board of visitors to West Point just made to the secretary of war, states that the equipment of the natural philosophy and chemistry classes is wholly inadequate; that the cadets' hospital is entirely unsuitable; that the barracks are constructed and lacking light, and the observatory is not in working order but in a dilapidated condition generally.

Fort Struck by Lightning—Seven Men Killed. Fort Monarca, at Neuvitas, was struck by lightning on the night of the 10th inst. The powder magazine exploded instantaneously with the explosion an artillery of the garrison were killed. One of the rifle cannons was carried a distance of fifty yards from its embrasure. Fort Monarca was built by the city of Neuvitas in 1563 and was presented to the government in 1870.
