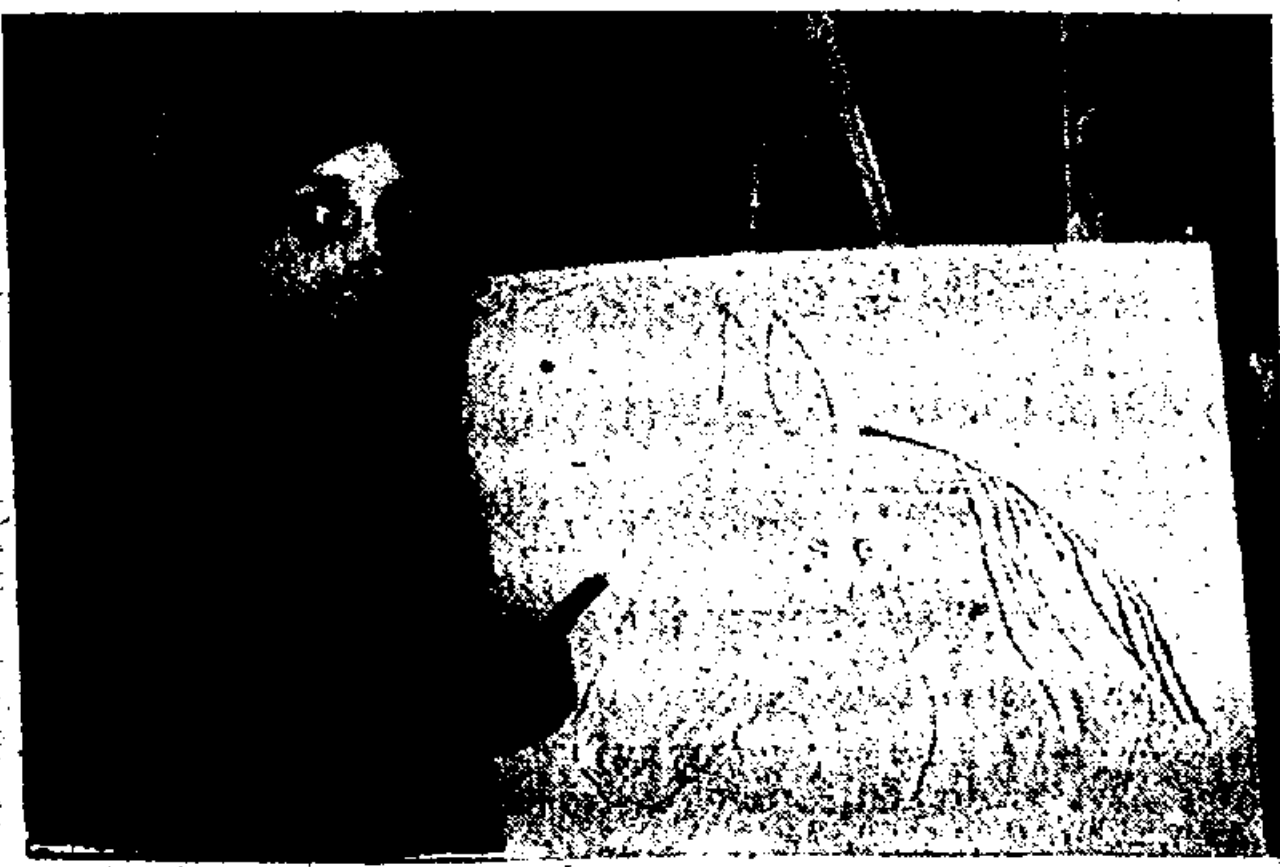

One Killed, Two Hurt in Auto

Wreck on Route 20

David Norman Hill, 25, of West Winfield, a former resident of Richfield Springs, was killed and two others seriously injured in a car-truck accident on Route 20 about a mile and a half west of the intersection with Route 28, on Thursday, March 18th.

According to Trooper R. T. Bobnick's report, Hill was travelling east on Route 20 while a truck driven by Stanley Casler, 46, of Clayville, was proceeding west. At a point near the entrance to the Gunset Ski Bowl the Hill car crossed the center line of the highway and collided head-on with the Casler truck. The impact threw Hill from the car. Hill's death was called accidental from head and multiple injuries.

Joseph Felice, 18, in the car with Hill, suffered a broken jaw and multiple cuts, and was taken to MIB Hospital in the Richfield Springs emergency ambulance.

Casler suffered cuts and fracture of his left knee, and was taken to Faxtan Hospital, Utica, by the West Winfield emergency ambulance.
