In Common Council.—Present last evening: The Mayor, Devlin, Everts, Griffin, Esbn, Merriman, McLaugh, Sayre, Townsend and Weaver.

A petition was presented by Ald. MERRIMAN from Health Officer F. W. KLAUG giving sundry reasons why he feels growing upon the public streets should be moved down and carried away.

Ald. SAYRE unwittingly provoked a short and saucy discussion, by reporting in favor of the bill of Childs & Williams for printing the recently adopted rules of the Council.

Ald. GRIVINS resented in favor of honorably discharging Ald. SAYRE from the Fire Department, with a certificate of five years service.

Ald. GRIVINS, from the Special Committee with reference to the Broadway Sewer, said that, in answer to a letter, they had been informed by Canal Commissioner SKINNER that he would meet them in this city before very long in order to confer with them on the subject of the damages and adjust them as between the State and the city.

Several resolutions for sidewalk repairs, the improvement of streets, etc., were adopted.

Ald. MERRIMAN called up the resolution proposing an appropriation of \$600 additional to the former appropriation of \$300 for the enlargement and improvement of No. 7's engine house.

Ald. GRIVINS inquired after a report from the Special Committee appointed to examine the subject of the hydrants.

A resolution was read and adopted, authorizing the Mayor to appoint a Committee of three to inquire into the matter of embankments in the city, and report measures for securing the number of volunteers it has furnished since the first of November last, that they may be credited on its quota for the draft.

The Council adjourned to a free supper at Mr. ELLIOTT'S Saloon, where they made themselves social and merry for an hour or more.

Fire.—About half-past twelve last night a canal barn in the rear of Wm. CARBY'S grocery and provision store, corner of First street and the Canal, was discovered to be on fire by a Mr. PHILLIPS. He undertook to rouse Mr. CARBY's family, but did not succeed in doing so until he had burst in the door. In the mean time the alarm had spread, and the work of emptying Mr. CARBY'S building and others adjoining was done in a hurry. The fire rapidly spread among the nest of wooden buildings which surrounded it. The barn was consumed, and the building occupied by Mr. CARBY was pretty much disposed of. The dwelling adjoining, occupied by JAMES MERRIMAN and Mrs. JAMES KIRBY was also thoroughly burned out. Both these buildings were owned by Mr. E. K. GOODWIN. Mrs. KIRBY was not aroused until it was too late to dress herself, and herself and little child had to be carried out. Mr. CARBY'S stock was not insured. We are not informed whether the buildings were or not. The next building north, owned by Mr. PATRICK COBBALTY, and occupied by JAMES GOODALE and Miss JESSIE JEFFERS was burned a good deal. The long building on the corner of First and Catharine, also owned by Mr. COBBALTY, and occupied by himself and family as a druggist, grocery and provision store and cigar shop, was also injured considerably, and saved with difficulty. Its contents were removed. Mr. COBBALTY was sufficiently insured to cover all losses.

The Fire Department arrived promptly and worked effectively, but some of the hose turned out to be in a bad condition. But little movable property was consumed in any of the buildings. It would have been a very damaging fire if there had been an east wind, but not a breeze was stirring. Its origin is unknown.

UNCONSTITUTIONAL EXPULSION.—As the 3.20 P. M. train, going East, passed Oriskany yesterday, a respectfully dressed man, whose broadcloth was protected by a clean lined "duster," got on board. The individual had apparently been indulging in stimulating beverages sufficiently to be obtuse, and when the "gentlemanly conductor" approached him with the one word "ticket," which all conductors use, he declined to produce either ticket or money.

The conductor politely insisted that he must have one or the other, or put the aforesaid gentleman off the train. The fellow then threw himself on his muscle, and roared that there were not men enough on that train to eject him therefrom.

The conductor seized the bell-rope; the train stopped; two burly brakemen seized our traveling friend by the collar; there was a momentary confusion—a glimpse of an indefinite number of arms and legs performing gyrations through the air—and the next moment the gentleman with the linen duster, soused into the ditch beside the track, completely taking the starch out of his linen, but not taking a particle of the spirit out of his person. He rose from his bath, dripping with water, having somewhat the appearance of a wet hen, but as cross as that fowl when in the process of incubation.

The fellow then threw himself on the track declaring his expulsion "unconstitutional," and threatening the vengeance of Gov. SKINNER for being treated in such a fashion without "due process of law." We doubt not that it disagreed with the gentleman's constitution, at least. The wonder is how railroad conductors can be guilty of such "unconstitutional" acts as to eject passengers without having applied to any magistrate, or having a writ from any court whatever. This matter should be referred to the "Democratic" State Convention, as another evidence of the invasion of the "rights of the citizen."

ROMY.—President BARNARD, of Rome, has appointed a precautionary Special Police force for that village. The Citizen is out on the Sentinel this week severely, and with good reason. We extract: The Sentinel for several weeks past has bawled itself hoarse relative to the enrollment in this town. It declared that it was a partisan affair—that it was made by Black Republicans—that the enrollment was every thing but what it should be, in short, it intimated that Democrats alone are to be enrolled, and that the wicked Abolitionists were to go free. We did not suppose the enrollment was to be perfect. We did not know all these statements were false and malicious, and to prove this to the satisfaction of everybody we procured a copy from Provost Marshal Richardson and published the same last week. The list was promptly copied into the daily Sentinel which as yet has but a limited circulation.

Now mark the result. As we anticipated, a large number who should have been enrolled are found to be omitted, and the enrolling officers have been gathering up the names. We have been informed that nearly one hundred such cases have been discovered, and the still more remarkable fact appears, that four out of five of those overlooked are Democrats! So palpably true is this fact that our neighbor has become alarmed, and notwithstanding his reiterated demands for the thorough publication of the list, excluded it altogether from the columns of the weekly Sentinel, which has a circulation five or six times that of the daily. The theory did work as was anticipated, and the further publication was therefore repressed.
