London, April 14 (AP)—Yugoslav Partisans opened a concentrated attack today on German forces trapped in a huge rocky fortress overlooking Cazin in an effort to complete occupation of the western Bosnian town, 60 miles south of Zagreb.

A communiqué from Marshal Josip (Tito) Broz' headquarters said the Partisans had overrun the town, except for the fortress, where the Germans were making a last stand.
